

The Definition of a Student's Community Service

When earning community service hours, a student must provide service for the common good through which he/she derives no personal gain other than the satisfaction of contribution to others' welfare. Activities conducted within any given organization or which the student provides the service must be non-profit unless the organization is sponsoring a philanthropic project.

The following information will provide you with the answers you need to complete the required community service hours.

Graduation Requirements

- 48 hours of service
- Completed throughout 9th - 12th grades
- Turned into Mrs. Williams

Citizenship/ Government

and/or

Senior Year Requirement

- 16 hours of service
- Completed during your senior school year
- Turned into Mr. Tymchuk

Types of Community Service



What Community Service *IS* and What Community Service *IS NOT*...

What it /S

- Helper at a community library
- Involvement with any recognized philanthropic organization
- Helping on church-sponsored community outreach events or childcare
- Get-out-the-vote campaigns
- Distribution of material
- Attending public meetings
- Volunteering as a camp counselor
- Helping with community events i.e. Parks & Rec programs, clean ups, etc.
- Mowing a lawn to help a disabled or elderly person
- Senior citizen help with groceries, etc.

What it IS NOT

- Babysitter for hire
- Tasks done at home
- Preparing for or participating in a religious service
- Campaigning or distributing material for a candidate
- Community service performed as disciple for behavior
- Working for a profit-making business
- · Working as a paid camp counselor
- Inviting a neighbor to dinner your parents prepared
- Mowing your grandparents lawn



On the day of your Community Service

- Introduce yourself with your first and last name, identifying yourself as a Reedsport Community Charter School student who is looking for a community service opportunity.
- If they tell you about an opportunity that you want to participate in, be sure to write down the location, date, time and contact person's information. Thank them for the information.
- 3. Be polite, represent yourself and your school in a positive light, and enjoy your opportunity to serve!!
