DEFINITION

When earning community service hours, a student must provide service for the common good through which he/she derives no personal gain other than the satisfaction of contribution to others' welfare.

Activities conducted within any given organization for which the student provides the service must be non-profit unless the organization is sponsoring a philanthropic project.



COMMUNITY SERVICE

What It Is and What It Is Not...



What It Is

- Helper at a community library
- Involvement with any recognized philanthropic organization
- Helping on church-sponsored community outreach events or childcare

What It Is Not


- Babysitter for hire
- Tasks done at home
- Preparing for or participating in a religious service

What It Is

- Get-out-the-vote campaigns
- Distribution of material
- Attending public meetings
- Volunteering as a camp counselor
- Helping with community events i.e. Parks & Rec programs, clean ups
- Mowing a lawn to help a disabled or elderly person
- Senior citizen help with groceries, etc.

What It Is Not

- Campaigning or distributing material for a candidate
- Community service performed as discipline for behavior
- Working for a profit-making business
- Working as a **paid** camp counselor
- Inviting a neighbor to dinner your parents' prepared
- Mowing your grandparents' lawn

 2. If they tell you about an opportunity that you want to participate in, be sure to write down the location, date, time and contact person's information. Thank them for the information.

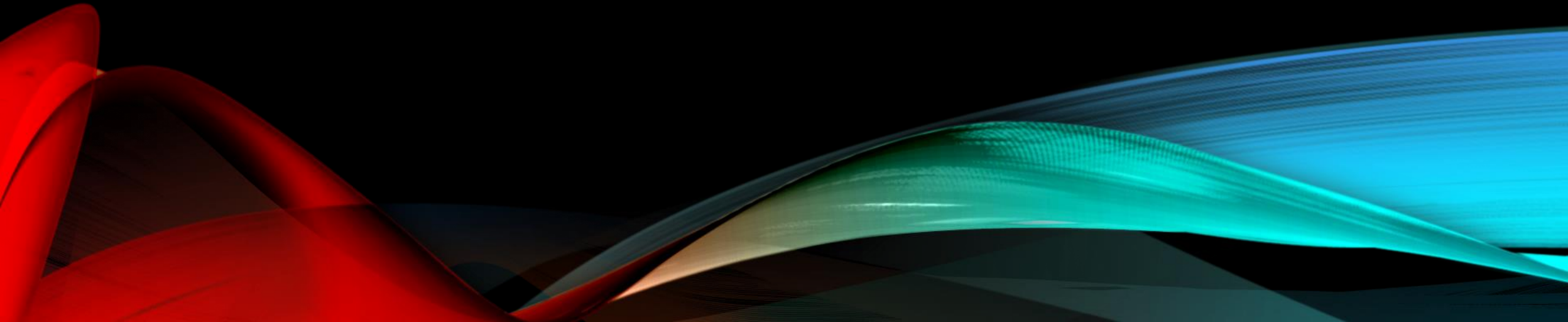

COVID CHANGES FOR OREGON PROMISE

- Oregon Promise Updates — As of 8/17/2020
- **Awarding Update: 22,000 EFC for Class of 2020**
- Oregon Promise awarding has **finalized** for students who will start college between Fall 2020 and Spring 2021. There is an *Expected Family Contribution (EFC) limit* of 22,000 due to a budget cut from the Oregon Legislature, which resulted in revoking awards for students with an EFC above 22,000 for Class of 2020 applicants. - **Awarding Update: Class of 2020 EFC Limits**
- Oregon Promise awarding has **updated** for students who will start college in Fall 2020. There is an *Expected Family Contribution (EFC) limit* of 34,000 and an anticipated budget cut, which would result in revoked awards for students with an EFC above 18,000 for Class of 2020 applicants. CHAFEE EDUCATION AND TRAINING GRANT

- Purpose
- The Department of Human Services (DHS) Independent Living Program (ILP) has received Chafee Education and Training Voucher (ETV) funding to help current or former foster care youth with postsecondary education and training.
- Eligibility Requirements
- To be eligible, you must:
- Currently be in child welfare foster care, **or**
- Had been in child welfare foster care for at least 180 days (six months) after your 14th birthday and **exited substitute care at age 16 or older, or**
- **NEW:** Be a former foster youth who was adopted or entered into a guardianship on or after your 13th birthday, and your adoption/guardianship finalized after **9/1/2015**.
- **NEW:** Final disbursement will not exceed the term before the youth turns age **26**.
- **NEW:** Students can receive the ETG for a maximum number of 5 years.
- Students no longer need to be accessing Chafee funds before age 21.
