- **Aurora Masonic Lodge #59 & Rebecca's Scholarship: \$2000**
  - One or two scholarships in the amount of \$2000. Open to a graduating RCCS senior who is planning to attend a two year or four year college.
- **Butch Thompson Memorial Scholarship: \$500**
  - Open to seniors admitting to and planning to attend the University of Oregon in Eugene. Please include a copy of your U of O admission letter with this application.
- **Cow Creek Band of Umpqua Tribe of Indians Scholarship: \$1500**
  - Open to a graduating RCCS senior who is planning to attend a Umpqua Community College.
- **Dunes Family Health Care / Lower Umpqua Hospital Foundation Community Health Services Scholarship: \$500 to \$1,750**
  - Open to all RCCS seniors and past graduates planning to pursue career opportunities in the medical field, which include therapists, medical technicians, office careers, nursing, pharmacy, plant maintenance, etc. (not limited to just the list—there are so many more).
- **Education Continuance Scholarship: \$500**
  - Open to seniors who have a 3.0+ GPA, have shown responsible behavior and regular attendance, and have selected a two-or four-year college to attend in the fall. There will be two awards of \$500.
- **Ival S. Wilson Memorial Scholarship: \$500**
  - Open to graduating seniors who have a GPA of 3.0+ who plan on attending a two-or four-year college in Oregon. In addition to the first two requirements, there is an order of subject matter preference in determining scholarship winners: 1. Major in print journalism, 2. Major in graphic arts, or 3. Major in communications. Financial need will not be a consideration.
- **Gardiner Odd Fellows Scholarship: (2) \$1,500**
  - Open to a graduating RCCS senior who is planning to attend a two year or four year college.
- **Hanna Family Perpetual Foundation: \$500**
  - Open to seniors who will be who is planning to attend a trade school, two year college or four year college.
- **Jack Adams Memorial: \$1,000**
  - GPA 3.00+ Open to a graduating RCCS senior, involved with watercolors, oils, acrylics, sculpting or mixed media who is planning to attend a two-year or four year college. Three samples of art work must be submitted (include size, media and date completed), photocopies of art allowed, cover letter about art goals and personal interview required.

- **Lakeside Community Women's Club Scholarship: \$500**
  - Open to a graduating senior who resides in Lakeside or Hauser. Applicant must be enrolled in a two year or four year college. One page biography including why you are needing the scholarship.
- **Leslie B. Freeman Engineering Scholarship: \$1,000**
  - Must have an interest in the field of engineering.
- **Lorrie L. Perkins Memorial** offers a scholarship to a graduating Reedsport-area student with a GPA of 2.5 or higher who will be attending an accredited vocational school or college majoring in performing or technical arts.
- **Marlene Tympchuk Memorial Scholarship: \$1,000**
  - Students must have a 3.00+ GPA and need to submit a 300-word essay about your favorite teacher and how they positively influenced your life.
- **Marne Humphreys Memorial Scholarship: \$1,000**
  - Students must have a 3.00+ GPA and need to submit a 250-word essay about your favorite book and why it is your favorite. (Cannot be *To Kill a Mocking Bird*)
- **Moose 2442 Marjorie Falk Scholarship**
  - Open to RCCS seniors.
- **Oregon Coast Anglers Scholarship: \$1,000**
  - Complete separate application.
- **Partners In Education Scholarship: \$250 - \$500**
  - Open to RCCS seniors attending a community college or university.
- **PEO Memorial Scholarship: \$1500**
  - Open to women who have a 3.0+ GPA and need to submit a 200 word essay on the importance of a woman having a college degree in today's world.
- **PEO Vocational Scholarship: \$750**
  - Open to women who have a 3.0+ GPA and submit a 200 word essay on the importance of a woman furthering her education beyond high school graduation.
- **Port of Umpqua Scholarship: \$1,000**
  - Graduating senior
- **Reedsport Area Lions Club Community Service Scholarship: \$200**
  - Open to graduating senior volunteering in the community. The scholarship is awarded to the student with the highest number of community service hours. (preferably including a variety of activities). In the case of a tie, GPA will be considered.
  - Student must submit an activities chart with only community service activities
- **Reedsport Association of Reedsport Educators (A.R.E.): \$500**
  - Open to RCCS seniors pursuing a degree in a school-related field i.e. education, school counselor, school nurse, speech pathology, school psychology, school autism specialist, etc.

- **Reedsport Liquor Locker Diversity Scholarship:**
  - Open to RCCS seniors who have attended RCCS for at least one year, with a GPA of 3.0 or higher. Must include a one page essay on why diversity is important in our community. Preference will be given to ethnic diversity.
- **Reedsport School Board Scholarship**
  - Open to students pursuing an education via trade school or degree at any community college or university. This scholarship is for materials needed for the program that is not included in tuition. Students need to include a budget with equipment listed and cost. If student awarded this scholarship receives and accepts a full ride scholarship, student will forfeit this scholarship and the money will return to the Reedsport School District Scholarship Fund.
- **(REEF) Jim Akre Tall Timber Awards: Various**
  - Open to students with a GPA of 2.5+. Multiple awards given and amounts vary.
- **(REEF) Lewis Memorial Scholarships: \$500-\$1,000**
  - Open to students with a minimum 2.50 GPA. Multiple awards given and amounts range between \$500 and \$1,000.
- **(REEF) Zack Turner Scholarship: \$500**
  - Open to seniors with a minimum 3.50 GPA.
- **Ryan Clardy Scholarship: \$500**
  - Open to RCCS seniors with a GPA of 3.0 or higher who are planning to attend a vocational or trade school.
- **Steve & Jerome Kenagy/Wes Lockard Scholarship Foundation: \$3,000**
  - Open to students pursuing a four year college education with an emphasis on electronic media.
- **Smith River Grange Scholarship: \$1,000**
  - Open to students who volunteer at the Smith River Grange or who are majoring in a science field.
- **Southwestern Oregon Community College Academic Scholarship: Tuition waiver**
  - Open to students who have a 3.75+ GPA.
- **Tom and Marlene Tymchuk Scholarship**
  - Open to students with a GPA of 2.75+ and preference given to students planning a career in business, forestry, education and trade schools.
