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## **Local Service Plan Yearly Process**

The local Service Plan (LSP) is developed in tandem with the ten component school districts each year. The team begins the process each September for the following school year and comes to a vote on the design by November. The following months are spent outlining new programs and revising existing programs to meet the ever changing needs of the component districts, the laws governing the work, and the programs themselves. Districts order services by April 10 for the following school year.

### **Process**

1. Develop timeline based on specific needs of the year
2. Review the existing LSP and brainstorm potential changes
3. Investigate/Present changes
4. Complete District Priority Survey per recommendations from Superintendents Council
5. Vote on LSP Agreements
  - a. Out of District Fee Formula
  - b. May Adjustment Language
  - c. Service Adjustment System
6. Vote on LSP at Superintendent and Board Levels
7. Present Tier 1 and Tier 2 Budgets
8. Meet with Districts Regarding Program Data
9. Provide Support for Ordering Services
10. Districts Submit Orders
11. Districts Sign/Submit Tier 2 Resolution Contract

The ESD will request to be placed on the superintendent meeting agenda in November, December, January and February. We will plan to present on these topics at the monthly Superintendent meeting. ORS 334.175 5) A local service plan must:

\*(a) Be adopted by the board of the education service district.

\*\* (b) After being adopted by the board of the education service district, be approved on or before March 1 by resolution of two-thirds of the component school districts that are a part of the education service district and that have at least a majority of the pupils included in the average daily membership of the education service district, as determined by the reports of such school districts for the preceding year, enrolled in the schools of the school districts.

## **Local Service Plan Requirements**

**Division 24: Standards for Education Service Districts, provide legal guidance for ESDs and their work. ORS 581-024-0205, specifically outlines the Core Services and Core Service Goals for ESDs.**

“Core services:” major categories of services that districts must provide to include:

1. Services for children with special needs;
2. Technology support;
3. School improvement;
4. Administrative and support.

\*Other services may be provided if approved in a local service plan.

“Core service goals:” The goals of a district in providing core services are to:

1. Improve student learning;
2. Enhance the quality of instruction;
3. Provide professional development to component school district employees;
4. Provide students equitable access to resources;
5. Maximize operational and fiscal efficiencies for component school districts.

## **Local Service Plan Timeline Requirements**

ORS 334.175 5) A local service plan must:

(a) Be adopted by the board of the education service district.

(b) After being adopted by the board of the education service district, be approved on or before March

1 by resolution of two-thirds of the component school districts that are a part of the education service district and that have at least a majority of the pupils included in the average daily membership of the education service district, as determined by the reports of such school districts for the preceding year, enrolled in the schools of the school districts.

## **Opt Out Provision**

SB 529 expands the intent of SB 250 which began a pilot of ESDs that would allow a school district within any of those ESDs to withdraw from their ESD. ORS 344.015 states:

“(3)(a) A school district board that chooses to withdraw a school district from the education service district must submit a notice of intent to withdraw to the board of directors of the education service district no later than November 1 of the year prior to the year in which the school district plans to withdraw from the education service district”.

“(b) A school district board that submitted a notice of intent to withdraw as provided by paragraph (a) of this subsection must submit a notice of withdrawal to the board of directors of the education service district no later than March 1 of the year in which the school district plans to withdraw from the education service district”

“The withdrawal of a school district from an education service district becomes effective on July 1 after the board of directors of the education service district issues the order described in subsection (3) of this section”.

## Local Service Plan Design

The Local Service Plan has two tiers. Tier one includes services that meet “Core Service” OAR requirements, provide services to all districts, provide services equitably for all districts and stabilizes services. Tier two allows districts to choose what services they want to purchase by “ordering” services by a specified process/timeline. The district’s allotment of resolution dollars are subtracted from total order and the ESD will bill the district for any services above their resolution allotment.

### Tier One: Core Services

Tier 1 services will be offered in each of the four core areas as unanimously agreed upon by participating component school district Superintendents.

#### Core Areas

Admin/Support  
Technology  
Special Education  
School Improvement

### Tier Two: Menu Services

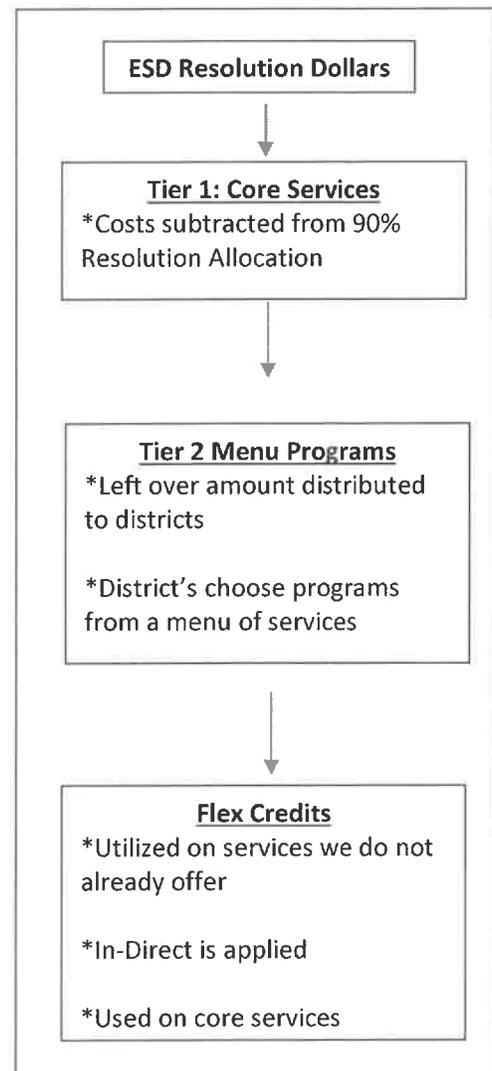
Districts will select services that they want from a list of programs.  
Services will be ordered in units that the district determines based on their individual needs.

### Flex Credits

Once the districts have ordered Tier 2 services and have remaining service credits they may access their resolution dollars through an interagency agreement under specific parameters.

Flex Credit Parameters:

- Utilized for services we do not already offer
- Must be utilized on programs/staff that fit into the major categories of service or “core services” as designated by the ORS
- In-direct will be applied to amount determined



## **LSP Agreements**

**Opt Out:** Opt out legislation passed during the 2013 legislative session and was fully implemented during the 2014-2015 school year. Opt out parameters adopted by the component school districts include:

- Districts who successfully complete the opt out process will receive 90% of the money designated for their school district in a given school year in cash payments.
- Districts who initiate the opt out process by the November 1 timeline will participate in Local Service Plan discussions but may not vote on the LSP for the current year.
- Districts who opt out and wish to purchase services will be charged an “out of district” fee.

### **Out of District Fee Formula**

School districts that choose to opt out of the ESD and as a result the consortium will unfortunately cause our districts unit costs to rise by the amount of in-direct lost from the resolution dollars that will go directly to the district. As a result, the ESD and the component district determined that an out of district fee would be assessed for any district that opted out and wanted to buy back services. With the concept in mind that the ESD did not want to make money off of the opt out districts rather just break even the following formula was developed.

$$\begin{aligned} \text{Out of District Fee} &= \text{Indirect Fee} + \text{Buy Back Fee} * \text{Buyback} \\ \text{Buy Back Fee} &= \text{Reduction of Indirect} / \text{Total Amount of Buyback} \end{aligned}$$

### **In-Direct Calculation**

In-direct is calculated using the “Breakeven” concept. Essentially, the ESD will only collect the amount of money for in-direct that it needs to run the overhead portion of the ESD that is not supported by the 10% provided in the state school fund.

The ESD will provide districts with a cost breakdown of the overhead budgets, revenues obtained from other sources and the amount needed to sustain the overhead program. In-direct is applied to each program and not to the whole of the resolution dollars. As a result, districts pay in-direct only on the programs that they purchase.

### **May Adjustment Language**

1. To begin the LSP process, the ESD will base the ESDs budget and district allocation using the information and recommendations at our disposal.
2. The ESD will revise the budget and allocation in May reflecting the most recent estimate adjusted by any prior year corrections.
3. The total cost of Tier 1 services will be subtracted.
4. The May current year adjusted total of the ESD allocation, plus or minus prior year corrections, minus Tier 1 services will be distributed to districts to utilize in the Tier 2 menu system.
5. In-direct will be adjusted with the May SSF adjustment, and district order amounts to the “breakeven” formula.
6. The unit costs will be adjusted to reflect that change.
7. SSF allocation and total order costs will be redistributed to districts.

## End of the Year Processes & “Go Back” Dollars

Beginning with the 12-13 school year, the ESD and the Component Districts implemented the first year of a new Local Service Plan with a drastically different system. Districts now order services from a menu of options. Any remaining dollars in Tier 1 and Tier 2 service programs ending balance now belongs to the school districts.

### Tier 1

The Tier One resolution dollars are subtracted before they are divided out to the individual school districts. Since all districts participate and the money is taken from the 90% before it's distributed, the fairest way to determine repayment of carryover is to use the same percentage of ADMw that was determined per district at the time the funds were distributed.

The chart below shows how the funds would be distributed. Please note the amount to be distributed in the chart below is for illustration purposes only; it is not the carryover amount. That amount will be provided after the audit.

### Tier 2

The Tier Two program services are ordered based on district need. The amount ordered does not reflect district ADMw and as a result, the carryover distribution should be based on what the district puts into the program. The chart below shows how the funds would be distributed. Please note the amount to be distributed in the chart below is for illustration purposes only. It is not the carryover amount. That amount will be provided after the audit.

### **Distribution Parameters**

- Reimbursement within the program will only be distributed to the year in question participants
- The allowable distribution type (cash or credits) will be determined by the local service plan that is in place the year the funds were distributed.
- Funds will be distributed after the audit is complete

### **Distribution Process**

1. Each district will tell the ESD which services they want to be allocated as using resolution dollars.
2. At the end of the fiscal year and after the audit, the ESD will use the component district agreed upon method for distributing carryover, for Tier One and Tier Two services.
3. The ESD will chart the carryover amounts in each Tier One and Tier Two programs. It will include:
  1. The districts participating in the program.
  2. The type of funds used (resolution or contract) by each district.
  3. The amount of money that the individual district will get back from the carryover in each program.
4. Based on the LSP for the year that the funds were distributed, the ESD will offer cash or service credits for the money distributed. For example, for years in which there is no flow through in the contract, resolution dollars that are deemed carryover must remain at the ESD in the districts account as service credits. Districts that use contract dollars for services, have the choice to receive the carryover in cash or service credits.

# Ordering Services

Services are ordered each year by April 10. This allows time for the ESD to make necessary adjustments to the program including staff and program design as well as assist the District in a transition process for large scale program changes.

Programs budgets are presented to the Superintendents prior to the ordering timeline. A standard format is utilized and specific information that the component districts want to be included is on the budget sheet. Programs are divided into a unit for purchasing that is most beneficial for Districts and the ESD such as FTE, hourly, by the student or by the participant. Districts will order the amount that they want and the ESD will work with them to adjust service level and type to meet the needs of the individual district.

The ESD is open to providing cost proposals on any service a district requests. These services can be included on the order form under the "other" column and can be made at any point during the year.

The District will utilize the order form found on the ESD Website under the Districts tab, complete their order and submit to the ESD. Program administrators are on hand to support the districts in understanding their data and determining their potential needs if requested. Service adjustments can be made as outlined in the Tier 2 contract and utilizing the Service Adjustment Form located on the ESD website.

Dear Board Members,

A discussion item on your agenda this month is the renaming of the baseball field behind the high school in Steve Pepiot's memory. I would like to have presented these comments in person, but unfortunately, I have a prior commitment on the same date as the Board meeting.

While I have the utmost respect for Steve Pepiot, and I do believe his contributions to our school and community should be memorialized in some way, **I urge the Board to table its discussion about renaming the baseball field, in favor of a broader discussion as to what is the appropriate procedure and manner in which to memorialize anyone**— not just Steve Pepiot, but any future contributor deemed worthy of such an honor.

Mr. Pepiot touched many young lives in our community—the vast majority of them being at Highland Elementary School. His time at the baseball field was as a JV baseball coach. While I am always one of the first people to praise the time and effort given to our schools and community by coaches, **Steve Pepiot's contributions were far more impactful at and within Highland Elementary. His memory should be preserved and honored at the Highland campus.**

As you know, the entire athletics complex behind the high school is currently named in honor of Mr. Rudy Ruppe. **I believe it is wrong to remove one person's name from something, in favor of another.** Doing so will set a precedent that could very well lead to the changing of names of memorialized areas every few years, on the whim of any seated Board. Please, do not open a "Pandora's Box", that can never be closed.

Not many of us were around some 50+ years ago, when the athletics complex behind the school was named in honor of Mr. Ruppe. As we look back through today's lens, we can question the wisdom of naming the entire complex in his memory, versus the individual fields. Was that short-sighted? Perhaps. But at the time, the decision obviously had the support of the Board and of the community. It was done, and that decision should be respected.

If we fail to respect that prior decision, then we can only ask ourselves, "How long will it be before a future Board changes the name yet again?"

I urge the Board to focus on creating a "memorialization plan"— an overall plan, or framework, for naming things in peoples' honor and/or memory that does not undo any previous naming. There are plenty of things that could be named in someone's memory:

- Individual classrooms could be named for people. There are plenty of classrooms, allowing for lots of future naming.
- Hallways or corridors in our school buildings could be named in people's memory.
- Other common areas, lobbies, libraries, courtyards and other outdoor spaces could also be named in people's honor.

In closing, I reiterate that I believe it is wrong— and sets a bad precedent— to remove one person's name in favor of another. Let's not make hasty, easy decisions. Let's get this right.

  - 1. Superintendent Zwemke read into the record the January 2026 Governor’s proclamation recognizing Oregon public school boards; the document was included in the board packet.

XI. REPORTS

- A. Audit Presentation – Kelsey Pardon, CPA, Neuner Davidson & Co. (virtual)
  - 1. The auditor reported that the District received an unmodified opinion, the highest level of assurance, indicating that the financial statements are presented fairly in all material respects in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.
  - 2. She reviewed Management’s Discussion and Analysis and highlighted the District’s year-end financial position, noting a positive change in net position for the 2025 fiscal year.
  - 3. The Governmental Funds Balance Sheet provides a practical reflection of year-end assets and liabilities by fund, including the General Fund, Special Revenue Funds, Debt Service Fund, and Capital Projects Fund.
  - 4. The Statement of Revenues, Expenditures, and Changes in Fund Balances shows the General Fund’s ending fund balance of \$1,552,670.
    - a. This represents close to 20% of total expenditure, which is considered a healthy fund balance level.
    - b. The District budgeted \$1.2 million as the beginning fund balance for the following year and exceeded that projection.
    - c. Special Revenue Funds ended the year with a fund balance of \$398,790, much of which is restricted federal and state grant funding; the District had budgeted \$233,000.

- d. The Debt Service Fund ended with a fund balance of \$473,000, compared to the budgeted \$500,000.
  - e. The Capital Projects Fund ended with a fund balance of \$185,000, compared to the budgeted \$223,000.
  - f. The Scholarship Fund reflects a year-end cash balance of \$228,982.
  - 5. Required Supplementary Information, including budgetary comparison schedules, showed that the District did not exceed appropriations in any fund.
  - 6. The Oregon State Compliance Report indicated that the District met all required compliance areas, including budget adoption and timing, deposits of public funds, state school fund factors, and insurance requirements.
    - a. Because federal expenditures exceeded the Single Audit threshold, auditors conducted a compliance review. The School Lunch Program was selected for testing, and no compliance issues were identified.
  - 7. The auditors reported no issues, discrepancies, or findings.
  - 8. Overall, the District's fund balances exceeded the amounts budgeted for the following fiscal year.

- 1. Presented an update on revenue categorization changes related to Federal Forest Fees, noting that the Oregon Department of Education (ODE) directed districts to reclassify certain funds as state revenue and to accrue the related amount to the prior fiscal year.

    - b. The Business Manager acknowledged the work of Assistant Business Manager Josh Cook in supporting the audit and financial reporting process.

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# Oregon Government Ethics Commission

## Statement of Economic Interest (SEI)

### Information for School Board Members

This flyer provides the key dates and steps required to complete your annual Statement of Economic Interest with the Oregon Government Ethics Commission.

### Who Must File

All elected school board members in Oregon are required to file an annual Statement of Economic Interest.

### Important Filing Dates

- **March 15:** Filing system opens for annual SEI submissions.
- **April 15:** Deadline to submit the annual SEI form.
- **May 15:** Final day to file without incurring additional penalties.

*Note: Late fees are automatically assessed by the Oregon Government Ethics Commission if deadlines are missed.*

### How to File Your SEI

1. **Watch for the email notification** sent by the Oregon Government Ethics Commission. This email includes your login link.
2. **Log into the OGEC E-File system** using the credentials provided.
3. **Complete each section** of the SEI form. Review carefully to ensure accuracy.
4. **Submit the form** through the E-File system. You will receive a confirmation message once completed.

### Tips for a Smooth Filing Process

- Check your spam folder if you do not receive the OGEC email.
- Log in early to avoid last minute issues.
- Review last year's SEI if you need a reference for consistent reporting.
- Update your contact information with OGEC to ensure proper email delivery.

If you have questions or require support: - Visit the OGEC website for detailed instructions and FAQs. - Contact the OGEC help desk directly for guidance. - Reach out to the district office if you need assistance locating prior filings.

Please complete your filing on time to meet state requirements and avoid fees.

## Naming Facilities

A guiding principle for the naming of district facilities is to exercise diligent care in determining an appropriate name. Consideration will be given to persons who have attained prominence locally, regionally, nationally or the name of a geographical area.

The general procedure for selecting a facility name will be as follows:

1. The Board will appoint a committee composed of two community members, one member of the teaching staff, one representative of the classified group, one student and one Board member.
2. The Board member appointed to the committee will serve as the chair.
3. Using the local media and other appropriate sources, the committee will invite community input for the selection of a name for a new facility or the possible name change of an existing facility.
4. A public input meeting will be scheduled for the committee to gain information from the community regarding various name options.
5. The committee will deliberate and present to the Board a list of three possible options with a recommendation of the committee choice.
6. The Board may take action on the committee recommendation, but only after consideration at two public Board meetings. The decision of the Board will be final.
